

via our social media platforms, which currently include Facebook,



"...what was helpful for me to figure out what God was calling me into, was creating a list of things that I wanted out of life," Maddie recalls. After making the list, Maddie knew that international mission was where God clearly was calling her.

In the summer of 2018, Maddie left the United States for the first time in her life and embarked on her first international mission trip to Tokyo, Japan. After summer trips of serving as a missionary to peers her own age, Maddie returned home to resume her college courses.

The experience was not one that you would have expected. "It was challenging in so many ways," Maddie shares. Over the next three months, Maddie prayed for clear direction as to where God would send her next. Class of 2016


