MULTILINGUAL SOCIETY CHAPTER







DESCRIPTION

The Multilingual Society Chapter at Crean Lutheran High School serves to recognize graduating high school students who have demonstrated significant progress toward achieving a high level of proficiency in English and in reading, writing, listening and speaking in another language.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Second-semester Sophomore or Junior
- Must have successfully completed three High School level courses in the LOTE with an A grade average.
- Cumulative unweighted academic GPA of 3.70 or higher and with an A average in both English and Languages Other Than English (LOTE) coursework.
- Students must explain orally or in writing to a faculty or staff member, in the LOTE, one of the topics listed below. The topic will be selected by the interviewer:
- the discipleship and/or Christian outreach efforts they have completed while making use of a language other than English. (The staff or faculty member, if satisfied with the explanation, must sign off on the application.)
- Information related to the increased interactions with native speakers they have had through the acquisition of knowledge in a language other than English.
- Students should demonstrate leadership, responsibility, respect, trustworthiness, and citizenship.
- · No incidence of academic dishonesty.

Lastly, in addition to completion of requirements listed above, students must fully complete the application, including the essay portion. Details concerning the essay are included on the application form.

MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

Once students are accepted into the Crean Lutheran High School chapter of the National Honor Society students are expected to:

- Complete a minimum of 15 documented service or leadership hours a year in the LOTE (service hours include any service projects, philanthropies, or volunteer opportunities both oncampus and off-campus)
- Attendance at monthly meetings
- Participation in an annual service project
- Maintain a cumulative unweighted academic GPA of 3.70 or higher, and A grade in their English and LOTE classes
- Lead by example on campus by following the outlined behavior expectations in the student handbook (e.g. uniforms, attendance, Christ-like behavior)
